

Academy re-opening plan

June 2020

Introduction

From June 15th, we want to build in an opportunity for students to spend time with their subject teachers revisiting key concepts from their year 10 curriculum and supporting with any gaps in their knowledge. We feel that our model allows us to do this whilst following government guidelines. At the heart of our plan, is the priority to look after the safety and welfare of our staff.

Phase 1: 8th June

Any member of staff who has been shielding needs to arrange a risk assessment meeting with myself (Mr Gummery) during this week. If you feel you are a member of staff who fall into one of the following categories, you must arrange a meeting either face to face or via Microsoft Teams. (Please contact Amy to arrange this meeting) Categories:

- Clinically extremely vulnerable
- Clinically vulnerable
- Living with someone clinically extremely vulnerable
- Living with someone clinically vulnerable
- Childcare issues
- Concerns for own welfare

Year 10 Pastoral staff will start the process by calling all students and arranging a Microsoft Teams meeting during this week. This will be a welfare call and will give us an opportunity to talk the students through the plan, so that they are aware of the rules and routines that they <u>must adhere</u> to during the following weeks of the academic year.

Staff actions:

- Teachers to attend on the rota for the vulnerable/key worker group as normal.
- Any staff that falls into the categories indicated above will need to discuss their case on individual basis with the principal.
- Year 10 tutor need to be available this week for the meetings with students.
- Pastoral team to contact year 10 students to book a timeslot.

Phase 2: 15th June – 10th July

Dependent on new information, we will start the final phase of the re-opening which will be contact time with the subject specialists.

We can have 25% of our cohort back on any given day, so we have decided to split the cohort into four distinct hubs. Each group will get one day a week face to face provision, alongside continued home learning.

Students will be met by senior staff and directed to the student hand washing station on arrival into the academy.

Students will be in for both the morning and afternoon session.

Morning: 10:00am – 12:00am

Lunchtime: Students will be asked to social distance and use the outside space to have their lunch. (Indoor plan may be used) Students will be asked to provide their own packed lunch with grab bags being made available for students on free school meals.

Afternoon: 12:30pm – 2:30pm

Student will only be allowed in their classroom with their teacher. Toilets will only be used before the session, at lunchtime and before they leave.

• All staff will be given a de-brief at the start of their working day, so that they fully understand the guidelines and risk assessments.

Lesson Expectations - Year 10 Lessons in School

The focus of these lessons should be:

- 1. Develop positive relationships with your students.
- 2. Recapping and reviewing home learning that has already been delivered to reduce curriculum gaps.

No practical lessons to be completed. All lesson should be theory based.

*please be mindful of the volume of work given to students.

Home learning

Home learning will continue for all years, but expectations of the amount of work set will be reduced by 50%.

There will be no more home learning for our current year 11 students.

Principles for staff

1. Do not come to work if you have coronavirus symptoms or go home as soon as these develop (informing your manager) <u>https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance/stay-at-home-guidance-for-households-with-possible-coronavirus-covid-19-infection</u> and access a test as soon as possible <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-getting-tested</u>

2. Clean your hands more often than usual - with running water and soap and dry them thoroughly or use alcohol hand rub or sanitiser ensuring that all parts of the hands are covered.

3. Use the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.

4. Avoid touching your mouth, nose and eyes.

5. Clean frequently touched surfaces and resources often using standard products that will be provided. Cleaners are in place to routinely clean common areas throughout the day (e.g. toilets and corridors, classrooms will be cleaned at the end of each day.

6. Think about ways to modify your teaching approach to keep a distance from children in your class as much as possible, particularly close face to face support (noting that it's understood that this is not possible at all times, which is why hygiene and hand cleaning is so important).

7. Consider avoiding calling pupils to the front of the class or going to their desk to check on their work if not necessary.

8. Help your class to follow the rules on hand cleaning, not touching their faces, 'catch it, bin it, kill it' etc. including by updating your classrooms displays with posters.

9. Prevent your class from sharing equipment and resources (like stationery).

10. Keep your classroom door and windows open if possible, for air flow.

11. Limit the number of children from your class using the toilet at any one time.

12. Limit your contact with other staff members, and don't congregate in shared spaces, especially if they are small rooms.

13. Make sure you have read the school's updated risk assessment, behaviour policy and know what role in it you're being asked to take.

If in doubt please ask your Principal for advice.

This guidance will be reviewed and updated regularly

Implementing Protective Measures to Minimise the Risk of Infection When School Reopens

Although we will strive to maintain social distancing the government and school recognise that it is difficult to guarantee that students will remain 2m apart from each other and staff. We have carried out this risk assessment before opening and addressed risks associated with coronavirus (COVID-19), so that sensible measures can be put in place to control those risks for children and staff. We cannot, however, guarantee that your child will not pick up an infection.

There will be no after school provision and breakfast provision available.

Children in receipt of free school meals and universal free school meals will receive the meal at school in the form of a grab bag. Existing free school meal vouchers for year groups that are attending school will stop from 1st June 2020.

What happens if someone becomes unwell at school?

If anyone becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature in an education or childcare setting, they must be sent home and advised to follow the COVID-19: guidance for households with possible coronavirus infection guidance.

If a child is awaiting collection, they should be moved to the meeting room in the reception area where they can be isolated behind a closed door, with appropriate adult supervision. A window will be opened for ventilation.

If they need to go to the bathroom while waiting to be collected, they will use the downstairs toilet facility. This will be cleaned and disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else.

Appropriate PPE will be worn by staff caring for the child while they await collection.

The meeting room in the reception area will be thoroughly cleaned with normal household disinfectant after the child with symptoms has left to reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people.

What happens if there is a confirmed case of coronavirus in a setting?

When a child or staff member develops symptoms compatible with coronavirus, they should be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 7 days. Their fellow household members should self-isolate for 14 days.

Where the child or staff member tests negative, they can return to their setting and the fellow household members can end their self-isolation.

Where the child or staff member tests positive, the rest of their class or group within their school should be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 14 days.
